CLASS DESCRIPTION

- 460. Pen of 3 market Lambs (1 Pen/chp)
 - Champion and Reserve Champion Market Lambs, each weight category, will receive a rosette.
 - Weight classes will be determined after weigh-in using above categories.
 - Ten or fewer animals in a class will be one weight class; 11 or more will make two weight classes; 21 or more will make three weight classes, etc.
 - Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champion Market Lambs will receive a banner.

DEPARTMENT FFA/SECTION 7: MEAT POULTRY

All rules as stated under youth poultry apply.

MARKET PEN

Three broilers or fryers, no more than 12 weeks of age. Any breed or cross.

FAT STEERS

- Weight classes will be determined after weigh-in. Steers/spayed heifers will be divided into 5 weight classes after weigh-in.
- Seven animals in a class will make one weight class.
- 8 or more animals will have two weight classes.
- 15 or more, three weight classes, etc.
- Any animal not weighing at least 950 pounds cannot show, nor may it remain on the grounds.

TO ENTER SHOWMANSHIP PLEASE REFER TO FFA SECTION 11

MEAT GOATS

1. All market meat goats must have milk teeth in place.
2. Market goats may be either wethers (castrated males) or doelings.
3. Animals having horns must be removed immediately following the show.
4. Market goats must weigh a minimum of 50 lbs to show. Goats will be divided into weight classes following weigh-in at fair. Goats must weigh between 50 and 150 pounds to sell.
5. All goats must be tagged or tattooed and weighed at an official market weigh-in. Tags and tattoos will be inspected upon arrival by the superintendent.
6. Exhibitors are expected to have the tag in their possession at weigh-in, show, and sale.
7. Market goats will be judged for their structural correctness and marketability.
8. Ten or less will be 1 class
9. 11-20 will be 2 classes
10. 21 or more will be 3 classes
11. Only the overall Grand Champion and Reserve will sell in the Kiwanis sale.

DEPARTMENT FFA/SECTION 11-SHOWMANSHIP & ROUND ROBIN

1. All FFA Showmanship contestants must use an animal shown in FFA this year.
2. All Showmanship contestants shall be in Official Dress (black pants, white shirt, FFA tie or scarf and FFA jacket) or specie specific. All Round Robin contestants shall be Official Dress only. White pants, hats, and gloves will not be allowed in the Round Robin contest.
3. Grooming Scores will be decided by a committee of all judges and will be used only as a first tie-breaker, second tie-breaker will be individual species score.
4. Once you win Round Robin, you must qualify in a different species to qualify for Round Robin.
5. Anyone may enter showmanship in a given species regardless of previous placing.
6. Goat exhibitors in the Round Robin will consist of the Champion Dairy Goat and the Market Goat Showman.

USDA WHOLESOME MEAT

The Laramie County Fair endorses and supports the USDA Wholesome Meat Act and insists exhibitors are in compliance, exhibitors of all market animals (beef, sheep, swine, market goats, poultry and rabbits) must certify their compliance with manufacturer's pre-market withdrawal periods specified for any and all medications, drugs, pesticides or feed additives administered. The use of any non-approved chemical or improper use of approved chemicals is strictly prohibited. Certification will be requested upon arrival at weigh-in at the County Fair.

All "Wholesome Meat Assurance Act" rules and regulations must be adhered to. The seller will be personally responsible for any animal which may be condemned because of chemical misuse. Any cost to prove or disprove the use of medications, tranquilizers, and/or injectable substances will be borne by the exhibitor. If proven guilty, the exhibitor will be permanently barred from the livestock sale.
