BUCKET CALF CONTEST

Entries will be accepted until 1/2 hour before show the day of the show. However, you may pre-enter on or before August 11th by calling the Fair Office. All contestants MUST check in at the Beef Barn show ring table by 1/2 hour before show the day of the contest.

1. The Bucket Calf contest is open to all Laramie County Youth ages 8 and under.
2. Calves shown must NOT be entered in any

other class at the Fair.

3. Calves exhibited must be orphaned calves.
4. Classes may be split by age of the contestants.
5. Calves will not be placed.
6. The judge will ask each exhibitor questions about their calves at the microphone after the calves have been shown.
7. Each exhibitor will receive an award for participating.

Ribbons will be awarded to third place in each class. Rosettes will be awarded to the Best of each Variety. A rosette will also be given to Best of Show and Reserve Best of Show.

Breeds:

- Abyssinian/Abyssinian Satin - short rough hair with many cowlicks or rosettes.
- American/American Satin - Smooth short hair all over.
- Cornet - Long hair with a rosette placed in the center of it's head.
- Peruvian/Peruvian – Long hair growing over the head and down the back, somewhat in a circular pattern.
- Teddy/Teddy Satin - Short kinky hair all over.
- Texel - Long hair with ringlets or corkscrew curls.
- White Crested - Smooth short hair over body with white rosette on forehead
- Any other - Any animal that does not fit any other breed classification.
- Weight Classes: (The varieties are divided into classes by weight)
- Junior - under 4 months of age, weighing 12-24 ozs.
- Intermediate - 4 to 6 months of age, weighing 24-32 ozs.
- Senior - 6 months of age or over 32 ozs.

****If you are in doubt about your class, check in early and we will place your animal in the appropriate class.**
