**TO ENTER SHOWMANSHIP, PLEASE REFER TO SECT. 71****MARKET SWINE WEIGHTS: 225 LBS – 285 LBS****Rules:**

1. Unhealthy animals will not be allowed to show or remain in the fairgrounds.
2. No Oil or Oily products may be used on hogs. Water Only.
3. No Swine will be reweighed. Underweight hogs will be shown in the feeder class, and overweight hogs will be shown in the overweight class. These animals will not be eligible for Champion hog, or to sell in the 4-H sale.

**BREEDS – will be determined at weigh-in****CLASS DESCRIPTION**

1. Market Swine
2. Pen of 3 Market Barrows/gilts owned by one exhibitor (Each hog weighing from 225-285 lbs.)
3. Pen of 3 Feeder Barrows/Gilts owned by one exhibitor (Each hog weighing less than 225 lbs)
4. Club Pen of Three owned by two or more exhibitors. (Each hog must weigh from 225-285 lbs).

**CAT SHOW WILL BE HELD AT ARCHER COMPLEX!  
TO ENTER SHOWMANSHIP, PLEASE REFER TO SECT. 71****General Rules and Regulations**

All rules and expectations for 4-H Show animal exhibitors will be applicable to the 4-H Cat Show.

1. The "Household Pet" cat is of mixed breed or unknown descent.
2. A purebred cat is one belonging to a recognized breed with characteristics maintained through generations of unmixed descent; may be registered with a recognized registry.
3. Kittens must be at least 4 months old and not

older than 8 months of age. Adult cats are older than 8 months of age. Because of susceptibility to disease, no kitten under 4 months of age will be accepted for competition.

4. No pregnant or nursing cats may be entered.
5. All cats and kittens must have their claws clipped. Declawed cats may enter the show and will not be counted down for declawing.
6. Do not enter your cat if you feel it will not be easily handled by the judge.
7. Each cat or kitten must be wearing a harness or collar (not a safety collar) and a leash. The exhibitor must always wear the leash on their wrist for safety reasons.
8. Exhibitors must furnish their own carpet square during judging. Exhibitors must provide a proper cage or carrier for their cats/kittens. Exhibitors must bring their own litter and litter box.
9. All exhibitors should wear long sleeve shirts or blouses with trousers or skirts. **No shorts allowed.**

**Health Requirements**

Cats must have current rabies and distemper shots. It is strongly suggested, but not mandatory, that all entries have the combination vaccinations, plus feline leukemia. Vaccinations should not be received within three weeks prior to the show. Health Certificates are required.

**Cats found to be ill or with parasites (fleas, ear mites, etc.) will not be allowed to show and will be dismissed from the grounds.**

**No cat or kitten may enter the show if there is any (feline) infectious or contagious disease in the household within three weeks prior to the show date.**

**4-H DOGS – SECTION 11**

**TO ENTER SHOWMANSHIP, PLEASE REFER TO  
SECT. 71****General Rules and Regulations**

4-H members qualify to enter the State 4-H Dog Show by showing in their county 4-H dog show AND:

**Showmanship** - youth won showmanship at county fair or the county 4-H Educator designated the youth - Champion Junior, Intermediate or Senior.

**Obedience** - received a qualifying score of (170) or above.

2. 4-H members carrying the dog project may use co-owned dogs (owned by the immediate family). The member must have sole care, training and showing of that dog for the current 4-H year and have a training contract.

**Ownership:** The dog lives in the same residence with the 4-H member and is owned by the 4-H youth or immediate family member (grandparents, mother, father, brother, sister).

**Co-Ownership:** Ownership ID Sheets extends beyond the family with two or more names on the papers to prove co-ownership exists. One of the names on the ID Sheet must be the 4-H youth or an immediate family member.

**Dog Training Contract:** The 4-H member may enter into an agreement to train someone else's dog in situations that may benefit the member, the dog or both. This arrangement is used for families with the inability to own a dog. **The training contract should not be used as a substitute for normal dog ownership.**

3. All dogs must be at least 6 months of age by May 1st to compete at the County 4-H Dog Show and 1 year of age by May 1st for agility classes. Dog ID forms should reflect the age of the dog.
4. Certificates for dog entries must show current immunization as per state veterinary guidelines.

**No animals will be allowed to exhibit at the Wyoming State Fair without a valid Animal Health Certificate.**

5. **All dogs must be on leash (excluding competition) and under control at all times. County Fair rules prohibit any dog from being any place but the site of the dog show.** Once the 4-H dog show is completed, all dogs must be removed from the fairgrounds.
6. Vicious dogs will be dismissed from the ring and must be removed from the premises.
7. Females in season will be allowed in classes. However, they will go through at the end of all classes.
8. Spayed, monorchid and neutered dogs may be shown without judging discrimination.
9. Dogs must be clean and well groomed.
10. The show committee reserves the right to ask anyone violating these rules to leave.
11. Judging of classes will be done with AKC rules as guidelines, however, specific Wyoming 4-H Dog Show Rules will supersede AKC rules.

**To Enter Showmanship, Please Refer to Sect. 71****Obedience**

1. A 4-H member may compete in only one obedience class per dog.
2. The first-year class is for members who are in their first year of the dog project, not the first year with a new dog. It is designed as a training class for members who do not feel competent to start in the On Leash class. Members may compete in the first year class only once.
3. An exhibitor who competes in the A groups with their first dog stays in the A groups with that dog for each level. The same is true for the B groups and levels. A member advances from On Leash A to Novice A. Same applies for moving in B classes.
4. A 4-H exhibitor with a dog shown previously in obedience classes by another 4-H handler or an obedience title must show the dog by these guidelines:
  - a. Junior and Intermediate age exhibitors may move back or down one level
  - b. Senior age exhibitors must show the dog at the highest level the dog has achieved
5. A dog receiving a qualifying score of at least 170 points at county fair may advance the following year to the next higher class but must advance after receiving 3 qualifying scores. Once the higher level of obedience is selected for the dog, the member may not drop back to the lower level with the same dog.
