DAIRY GOATS

DEPT. CON – SECT 17

Showmanship will not be combined but held separately prior to the judging of the individual dairy classes.

1. Only does will be shown in the dairy classes. No bucks will be on the grounds.
2. Animals must be owned by the 4-H or FFA member by June 1 of the current year.
3. No horned animals allowed on the grounds.
4. Tattoos and proof of ownership will be checked upon arrival by the Superintendent.
5. All exhibitors in dairy classes must show in white.
6. Dairy classes will be judged according to the American Dairy Goat Association rules and regulations. Goats registered as Purebred or American or unregistered Native on Appearance, will be shown in their respective breed class. All other dairy animals show in the Recorded Grade Class.
7. All goats will be bedded. Straw is allowed.
8. Non-Dairy will be judged and shown according to breed standards.
9. Please have all animals fed, watered and tended to before 9:30 a.m. each day and before leaving each evening. Any goats not receiving proper care will not be judged, will not receive premiums, and will be sent home.
10. SHOWMANSHIP: The beginning showmanship class is for the junior 4-H person who has never shown a goat before. No trophy will be awarded for this class; ribbons only. The top individual in the beginning class has the option to enter the junior showmanship contest to compete for the opportunity to represent Laramie County at the State Fair.
11. Dairy Herd – Entry to consist of 4 dairy animals owned by one exhibitor. Senior does only.

Junior Division – Animals under 24 months that have never been freshened.

- Junior Division Show Order
- Jr. Kid – Birth to under 4 months
- Sr. Kid – 4 months to under 8 months

Senior Doe Show will begin with Saanens and continue through breeds as listed. After selection of Best Senior Doe in Show and Best Udder in Show, the Junior doe Show will begin, starting with Saanen and continue through breeds as listed. Best Junior Doe in Show will be chosen after completion of Junior classes.

Persons with disabilities and wishing special consideration may enter classes at the fair. The letter "T" should be added behind the class number on the entry form.

- See page for entry dates and times. All exhibits must be grown in Laramie County.
- Competition in this division will be open to both irrigated and dry farm products.
- Agricultural exhibits must be the product of the current year, except in the case of corn, threshed forage seed, threshed grain and seed, and field peas and beans, which may be the product of the previous year or the current year.
- ALL AGRONOMY EXHIBITS MUST BE TURNED INTO THE FAIR OFFICE BEFORE PREMIUMS WILL BE PAID. No premium shall be awarded to unlisted classifications.
- FFA and 4-H exhibitors may not enter Open Class in this department, unless they do so with exhibits other than those exhibits in their own divisions.

CORN AND SORGHUM – SECTION 1

(Previous or current year, irrigated or not)

Each sample must consist of 5 ears. Variety name to accompany corn samples. Exhibitors are allowed up to three varieties in this division. Like varieties will be grouped and the judge will award appropriate ribbons.

CLASS DESCRIPTION

1. Corn & Sorghum

BALED HAY – SECTION 2

Entries in this division shall consist of a portion of a bale measuring not less than 18 inches in length. Entries must be a portion of a standard machine bale and must be tied with two strings or wires.

CLASS DESCRIPTION

1. Alfalfa Hay, first cutting
2. Alfalfa Hay, 2nd/3rd cutting
3. Native Grass Hay
4. Cultivated/Introduced Grass Hay
5. Mixed Grass/Legume Hay

SHEAF FORAGE FOR HAY – SECTION 3

- Sheaf forage shall measure 3 inches minimum and 5 inches maximum at the butt, except the millets, sudan and sorghums shall measure 5 inches minimum and 8 inches maximum.
