##### Rules:

1. All Market Goats must have USDA/APHIS Scrapie Identification tags in place prior to tagging.
2. Ownership, possession, and tagging date for all Market Goats is June 1.
3. All market goats must be 12 months or younger at the time of fair. Market Goats are to have milk teeth in place or may have lost one or both milk teeth, but there shall be no evidence of breaking skin or eruption of the two permanent teeth.

##### AS ABBREVIATED FROM THE WYOMING JUNIOR HORSE SHOW RULE BOOK, MOST CURRENT EDITION.

Proof of ownership (Horse Certification form) must be on file and complete, including endorsements, at the County Extension Office by June 21<sup>st</sup>, 2011. All classes shall be conducted according to rules contained in the current "Wyoming Junior Horse Show Rule Book." Safety helmets are accepted and encouraged in any class for headgear. Harness must be properly fastened. ASTI-SEI Helmets recommended. One entry is allowed per exhibitor in showmanship. One entry is allowed per exhibitor in each performance class. More than one entry per exhibitor is allowed in each halter class with premiums paid on a maximum of three entries per exhibitor in each class. 4-H horse members must pass the certification process to participate in the county horse show, to be able to show your horse in halter classes youth must pass section 1 and 2A of the certification. To be able to ride in classes, youth must pass section 2B of the certification. There are also endorsements that must be passed in order to participate in classes, they are as follows: youth participating in Trail classes must pass the trail endorsement, youth participating in speed and stock events must pass the speed endorsement, youth
