Rally

- Eligible entries are identified and entered by each county 4-H Educator.
- Youth can enter a single dog in only one rally class.
 - "A" classes are for dogs that have not had a qualifying Obedience or Rally score in AKC competitions or that do not have an Obedience or Rally Title in AKC competitions.
 - "B" classes are for dogs that have had a qualifying Obedience or Rally score in AKC competitions or that do have an Obedience or Rally Title in AKC competitions.
- Dogs soiling in the ring will be disqualified.
- All dogs must enter and leave the ring on leash. Those competing in on leash classes should do so with a 6-foot leash.
- Collars may be flat buckle (leather or nylon) or choke chains.
- No bait (dog treats) is allowed in the ring.

Junior, Intermediate, Senior is the 4-H age of the youth.

Advanced:	A dog which has been used for competition before and received a score of at least 70 points in a Novice class***.
Excellent:	A dog which has been used for competition before and received a score of at least 70 points in an Advanced class***.

4-H POCKET PETS – SECTION 12

- All Pocket Pets are to be brought in the day of the show and taken home upon completion of the competition.
- Pets must be confined to a portable Escape Proof Cage suitable for that particular species, while they are on the Fairgrounds. Exhibitors must provide their own cages. It is the total responsibility of the exhibitor to provide for the health and welfare of the animal while it is at the fair. Where appropriate, harnesses are required.
- No venomous pets.
- Exhibitors will be asked to discuss and have knowledge of their pet and may be asked to handle their pet at the judge's discretion.
- Any pet showing signs of illness will be removed from the grounds immediately at the discretion of the Show Superintendent.
- Exhibitors will be required to be with their animals at ALL TIMES.
- Animals must be owned by the Exhibitor by June 1.
- Classes will be broken accordingly at a natural basis by the Show Superintendent.
- Presentations may be up to 5 minutes long, but not to exceed that time limit. Handling skills and habitat and information may be demonstrated.

4-H DEPARTMENT H- STATIC EXHIBIT INFORMATION

1. Rules - It is the responsibility of the exhibitor/family to know and understand all rules and regulations. Unless specified, exhibits must conform to the same rules and regulations that apply to other departments at County Fair.
2. Entries must be exhibited at County Fair. It is the Responsibility of the 4-H member/family and to enter exhibits/entries in the correct classes. Incorrect entries can be disqualified.
3. All static exhibits should attach skills summary questions or exhibit may be penalized at judge's discretion. This should be on a 3x5 index card with at least the following questions: How did you get the idea for your project and what do you like best about it? What tools did you use and what skill(s) did you use or learn in making this project?
4. The Laramie County Fair or County extension staff will not be responsible for the loss of or damage to, any article or animal.
5. 4-H static exhibits are judged using the Danish system of placing (purple, blue, red, white).
6. In June, 1982, the 1940 agreement between the Wyoming State Department of Vocational Education and the Wyoming Agricultural Extension Service involving 4-H and FFA youth was reviewed and amended to read as follows: ***"If a boy or girl is enrolled in both 4-H and Vocational Agriculture or Home Economics, work done must be different in each. For Example: 4-H and FFA members may carry the same type of supervise occupational experience program in vocational agriculture pr as a 4-H project, but the exhibit must be different in each. The FFA exhibit must come from the supervised FFA program and the 4-H exhibit must come from a 4-H project."***
7. A project done in school should be eligible for display or show through one, but only one organization.
8. All classes are placed as judged.
9. Members are allowed 8 entries in each class with no like items. Like items will be disqualified.
10. All static exhibits going to State Fair will be transported by extension office. If a member's item is fragile or breakable, it is that member's responsibility to pack this item to go to State Fair on Saturday August 13th at 3:00 PM. The Wyoming State Fair, State 4-H Office, and the County Extension Staff will not be responsible for the loss of or damage to, any article or animal.
11. Multiple entries can be entered in each class as long as the projects are distinctly different, however you must enter these classes multiple times on your fair entry form. Example: A Jr. aged division member is bringing cucumbers, beans, and tomatoes, in order to be entered for all three vegetables, this member must have three entries on their fair entry form for H-29-1. If you have questions please call the fair office, or the 4-H office.
12. All static exhibits (all projects) will be judged on Saturday August 6th from **9-1**, unless otherwise stated in that section. Fabric and Fashion, Foods, and Food Preservation are all being judged on Friday August 5th, please see those sections for the judging times and locations.

2. Exhibits shall be mounted securely on a **stiff mounting board** or foam board of any color. To be mounted on size of board appropriate to the photo.
3. Ensure a hanging hole in the mounting board at top center or holes on left and right edges.
4. NO breakable glass allowed – use of Plexiglas or shrink plastic is allowed.
5. Multiple entries can be entered in each class as long as the projects are distinctly different, however you must enter these classes multiple times on your fair entry form. Example: A Jr. aged division member is bringing cucumbers, beans, and tomatoes, in order to be entered for all three vegetables, this member must have three entries on their fair entry form for H-29-1.
