Check-in will be Monday, August 8th from 1-5 PM only. All birds must pass the health inspection before entering the poultry barn. Cage and carry birds will be inspected the morning of the show. Dr. Emerich may ask for permission to take a mouth swab from random birds to test for Avian Influenza.

Check out will be August 12th after 2 PM or must obtain an early release form from the Fair office.

Poultry Rules

1. All birds must pass the vet check before they are put into show cages.
2. Animals unable to move normally, have bare backs, or appear unthrifty will not be allowed at the fair. The fair veterinarian has final say if an animal will be allowed on fair grounds.
3. Birds should be in adult plumage and/or at least 4 months old.
4. Market pen birds must be between 50 and 90 days of age.
5. Cage and Carry may be used for poultry unable to stay at the fair. Exhibitors must provide their own cage to show in. Birds in cage and carry must be in place prior to 8 am on show day and removed from the fair before 8 pm on show day. Cage and carry birds must pass a health inspection by either a show supervisor or a fair veterinarian.
6. Only three entries per class will be allowed.
7. All poultry must be called in to the Superintendent prior to bringing them to the Fair.
8. All poultry except market animals must be part of the regular project prior to June 1.
9. No poultry will be on the grounds that are not entered in a class.
10. Any birds placed in cages not assigned will not be judged.
11. Poultry will be taken care of by the 4-H members. Parents will be able to help only with initial set up and removal. Feed and water must be available at all times. Animals not taken care of in an appropriate manner will be excused from the grounds and all prize money will be forfeited.
12. Birds maybe entered in only one class, not including showmanship.

NO PUREBRED RABBITS WILL BE ALLOWED TO BE SHOWN IN THE CROSSBRED RABBIT CLASSES.

SIX (6) CLASS BREEDS

Rules:

1. Entries are limited to 2 per class (except meat pen, which allows one entry of 3 rabbits) per exhibitor.
2. This will be a carry cage show. This means that the member will carry the rabbits in a cage the day of the show, and take them home after showing that night.
3. If the member's cage doesn't have a floor or tray, the cages should be raised, either with bedding, or with tarps.

4. If the member should choose to commit to keep rabbits at the fairgrounds through the entire fair, they must stay on grounds and may not be removed until check-out time Saturday afternoon. All rabbits kept on grounds must be fed and watered daily, and cleaning under the cages must be done by the 4-H member.
5. All Best of Breed, Champions and Reserves, best of opposite Sex Breed, Fur, Wool, Meat Pen, Fryer fur, and Showmanship MUST be kept at the fairgrounds for public viewing.
6. Rabbits must be in the 4-H member's ownership and possession and included in their project no later than June 1 of the current year.
7. Rabbits must be free of disease and in good health to be exhibited and shown.
8. Rabbit Judging and Breed identification will be on Wednesday afternoon following 6-class judging.
9. All Rabbits are divided into two breed divisions. They are either 4-class or 6 -class.

2. Exhibits shall be mounted securely on a **stiff mounting board** or foam board of any color. To be mounted on size of board appropriate to the photo.
3. Ensure a hanging hole in the mounting board at top center or holes on left and right edges.
4. NO breakable glass allowed – use of Plexiglas or shrink plastic is allowed.
5. Multiple entries can be entered in each class as long as the projects are distinctly different, however you must enter these classes multiple times on your fair entry form. Example: A Jr. aged division member is bringing cucumbers, beans, and tomatoes, in order to be entered for all three vegetables, this member must have three entries on their fair entry form for H-29-1.
