SIX (6) CLASS BREEDS

Rules:

1. Entries are limited to 2 per class (except meat pen, which allows one entry of 3 rabbits) per exhibitor.
2. This will be a carry cage show. This means that the member will carry the rabbits in a cage the day of the show, and take them home after showing that night.
3. If the member's cage doesn't have a floor or tray, the cages should be raised, either with bedding, or with tarps.

4. If the member should choose to commit to keep rabbits at the fairgrounds through the entire fair, they must stay on grounds and may not be removed until check-out time Saturday afternoon. All rabbits kept on grounds must be fed and watered daily, and cleaning under the cages must be done by the 4-H member.
5. All Best of Breed, Champions and Reserves, best of opposite Sex Breed, Fur, Wool, Meat Pen, Fryer fur, and Showmanship MUST be kept at the fairgrounds for public viewing.
6. Rabbits must be in the 4-H member's ownership and possession and included in their project no later than June 1 of the current year.
7. Rabbits must be free of disease and in good health to be exhibited and shown.
8. Rabbit Judging and Breed identification will be on Wednesday afternoon following 6-class judging.
9. All Rabbits are divided into two breed divisions. They are either 4-class or 6 -class.

SECT. 71****SEE YOUTH SECTION FOR BREEDING SHEEP****MARKET SHEEP WEIGHTS: 90 LBS – 175 LBS****Rules:**

1. All overweight lambs will be shown in the overweight class. All underweight lambs will be show in the feeder class. However neither of these are eligible for sale in the 4-H sale or Champion Market Lamb.
2. Lambs will be weighed one time at fair, and weight divisions will be established and posted with at least 10 animals per weight class.
3. Lambs must be slick shorn and dry before they cross the scale at weigh-in. Only lambs without tack (no blankets, shirts, halters) will be allowed to cross the scale.
4. Alley ways and pens must be wet down twice daily by exhibitors. The superintendents or 4-H educator will monitor dust level in the barn and may request that any exhibitor wet down large areas in the barn to lessen the dust.

Speckled Face Lamb-

Wool Breed Crossbred-These are generally a cross between a wool breed and a Blackface (meat) breed. Lambs should show significant evidence of their wool breed ancestry. Skin will appear pink, white wool, brown/black spots in conjunction with wool on legs below the knees/hocks, significant brown/black spots on face plate. Being wool crossbreds, may also be smut faced (light dirty brown mottling on face and legs).

Black Face Crossbreds-

These are generally a cross between a blackface (meat) breed and a whiteface meat breed. Lambs will be black pointed, like a blackface breed; legs, ears, head, and belly will primarily be black. Will have significant white spotting on face plate, ears and below the knees/hocks.
