#### General Rules

1. Fashion Revue is open to all members enrolled in Fabric and Fashion, knitting, and crocheting.
2. Members will model according to age division.
3. Members will be allowed to model a total of 6 outfits, 5 constructed and 1 ready-to-wear. Constructed outfits must be made from different patterns.
4. An entry must be made in the Fashion and Fabric project under Buymanship in order to model Ready-to-Wear.
5. Each 4-H member must turn in a fashion revue script prior to judging modeling to be eligible.
6. The Public Fashion Revue will be held at East High School Auditorium on Friday August 5<sup>th</sup> at 7:00 PM.
7. 4-H members must model in public fashion revue to be eligible for premiums and to participate in the fashion revue at the Wyoming State Fair if they qualify.

#### 4-H SHOWMANSHIP CONTESTS - SECTION 71

#### RULES

1. Showmanship is open to juniors (8, 9, 10), intermediates (11, 12, 13) and seniors (14 and over). Only one junior, one intermediate and one senior may be designated from each county to qualify for state in each species.
2. 4-H members competing in 4-H showmanship in one species contest are not precluded from competing in the same species contest in FFA.
3. Showmanship exhibitors must compete with their own animals.
4. Preparation and showing of animals must be consistent with the rules in the livestock section.
5. No boars, stallions, beef bulls, or bucks (goats) will be allowed in any showmanship event. Rams (sheep) can be shown. No lactating animals will be shown except for dairy animals.
6. Judging will be on the basis of exhibitor's ability to present their animal for judging including the movement and positioning of the animal, as well as condition and cleanliness of the animal as it relates to being ready for show. Mannerisms, conduct of the showman, and

industry knowledge are also included.

- All showmanship classes must be pre-entered.

### Special Specie Exhibitor Rules:

- Sheep Showmanship** will be divided into market and breeding categories.
- Sheep, Dairy Goat and Meat Goat** - Demonstration of fitting and grooming equipment will not be required nor judged. It is expected that the fitting, grooming, and preparation of the animal be done by the contestant and will be considered by the judge.
