LARAMIE COUNTY BRED & FED — SWINE

(Must be entered on Entry Form)

Dept. CON – Sect. 6

Superintendent: Keith Heschke & Randy Meyers

1. All exhibitors must abide by all applicable rules and regulations of the Laramie County Fair.
2. The producer/breeder of the lamb must be a legal resident of Laramie County.
3. All hogs must be bred, born, raised and fed within the boundaries of Laramie County (with the exception of boars used in Artificial Insemination programs).
4. All hogs eligible for this show MUST be owned by a Laramie County 4-H or FFA member in good standing according to the by-laws of those organizations.
5. Hogs are to be on the fairgrounds for weigh-in (see schedule).
6. Hogs are to be checked in with the Superintendent at weigh-in.
7. Hogs will be weighed. Classes will be assigned by the Superintendent.
8. If hogs are to be shown in Market Hog classes, they must be entered on a separate line on the entry card for the Market Hog class.

LARAMIE COUNTY BRED & FED — LAMB

(Must be entered on Entry Form)

1. All exhibitors must abide by all applicable rules and regulations of the Laramie County Fair.
2. The producer/breeder of the lamb must be a legal resident of Laramie County.
3. All lambs must be bred, born, raised and fed

within the boundaries of Laramie County (with the exception of rams used in Artificial Insemination programs).

4. All lambs eligible for this show MUST be owned by a Laramie County 4-H or FFA member in good standing according to the by-laws of those organizations.
5. Lambs are to be on the fairgrounds for weigh-in (see schedule).
6. Lambs are to be checked in with the Superintendent at weigh-in.
7. Lambs will be weighed. Classes will be assigned by the Superintendent.

LARAMIE COUNTY BRED & FED MEAT GOATS

(Must be entered on Entry Form)

Dept. CON – Sect. 8

Superintendent: Troy Hall

1. All exhibitors must abide by all applicable rules and regulations of the Laramie County Fair.
2. The producer/breeder of the Goat must be a legal resident of Laramie County.
3. All goats must be bred, born, raised and fed within the boundaries of Laramie County (with the exception of bucks used in Artificial Insemination programs).
4. All goats eligible for this show MUST be owned by a Laramie County 4-H or FFA member in good standing according to the by-laws of those organizations.
5. Goats are to be on the fairgrounds for weigh-in (see schedule).
6. Goats are to be checked in with the Superintendent at weigh-in.
7. Goats will be weighed. Classes will be assigned by the Superintendent.

BEEF ULTRASOUND CARCASS CONTEST

DEPT. CON – SECT. 9

Superintendents: Dan Frank and Gene Stillahan

1. This contest is open to all 4-H and FFA members in Laramie County with market beef projects.
2. Limit: One (1) 4-H and FFA animal can be entered by each member.
3. Market steers and market heifers are eligible.
4. All animals entered will be scanned by a certified ultrasound technician at weigh-in.
5. Animals will be placed in order by the results of the ultrasound scan based on rib-eye area, back fat, inter-muscular fat and live weight.

- Results will be announced after the halter steer show on Thursday.

SUPREME COW CONTEST

Dept. CON – Sect. 10

Superintendent: Dan and Bobbie Frank

- This contest is open to all 4-H and FFA members in Laramie County with at least 2 years of membership eligibility left in either organization.
- Limit one heifer per contest, per year, designated as a Supreme Cow entry.
- 4-H members must be enrolled in Breeding Beef Project.
- The heifer will be eligible for 4-H or FFA Breeding Classes.
- All Phase I entries must be ultra sounded at beef weigh-in. Heifers shown to be barren by the ultrasound machine at the day of weigh-in will be eliminated from this contest.
- The registered or commercial heifer must be owned by Feb 1, and tagged and weighed at the Market Beef weigh-in held in February. Record books, which will be entered at the Fair, will be provided at this time.
- It is superintendent's discretion to release exhibits after the show.
- The winner of the calf must show the calf the following year. No alternate entries will be accepted.

Phase I: First Year

CLASS DESCRIPTION

- Bred Heifer

The bred heifer is shown at fair by the contestant and evaluated by a 4-member panel of judges, the official judge, and three commercial cattlemen.

Criteria for judging will include:

Showing Placing	(30 pts)
Record Book	(20 pts)
Interview	(15 pts)
Performance	(20 pts)

Phase II: Second Year (PHASE II OF SUPREME COW IS AN IN AND OUT SHOW)

CLASS DESCRIPTION

- Cow/Calf Pair

- A clear, color picture of the calf with cow will be taken within two weeks of the calf's birth for placement in the record book.
- The cow calf pair is weighed and shown at Fair.

Criteria for judging will include:

Performance	(35 pts)
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Interview	(15 pts)
Record Book	(20 pts)
Visual appraisal	(30 pts)

- The heifer must be shown both years to make the contestant eligible for second-year awards.
- All Phase II record books must be accompanied by the appropriate Phase I record book.
- Calf at side must be the natural calf (no grafts).

BREEDING BEEF

DEPT. CON - SECT. 11

Superintendents: Brian Cox, Dan Frank and Ty Berry

NOTE: Showmanship will not be combined but held separately at a different time. Check FFA and 4-H schedules in appropriate sections or in front of fair book.

- All breeding animals exhibited must have been owned by the member making the entry by Feb. 1 of the current year.
- Bulls more than eight months old must be shown with a nose lead.
- All Supreme Cow females entered in regular breeding beef classes must check in with the Superintendent for their respective classes.
- Supreme Cow females must be weighed in when arriving for fair. All other breeding beef and feeder calves do not need to be weighed..

Polled & Horned Herefords

Black Angus

Any other English Straight or Crossbreds

Maine Anjou or Maine Anjou Crossbreds

Any Other Exotic Straight or Crossbreds

Low Line & Miniature Breeds

In the event that 2 or more breeding females or breeding males of a breed not specified above are entered, the Laramie County Fair may add that breed to the above list and the animals will be shown within the breed according to the age designations below. If the breed of your animal is not listed, enter the animal in the appropriate "Other English Breed" or "Other Exotic Breed" Classes and list the Breed of your animal on the entry form.

Crossbred cattle derived of English & Exotic will show in Any Other Straight or Crossbred.

AGE DESIGNATIONS

- Junior Heifer or Bull Calf-Born between Jan 1 and Apr 30 of current year
- Senior Heifer or Bull Calf-Born between Sept 1 and Dec 31 of previous year
- Summer Yearling-Born between May 1 and Aug 31 of previous year
- Spring Yearling-Born between March 1 and April 30 of previous year
