3. Each exhibit or each piece of the exhibit must be identified with artist's name, age, county, year in project, and media used.
4. Oversize exhibits will be displayed as space permits.
5. For safety in handling and for attractive display at fair each exhibit must have an adequate hanger - either string or wire firmly attached. Do not use tape of any type to attach hangers. **Absolutely no pictures, posters or display boards not properly prepared for hanging will be displayed.** The 4-H department is not responsible for breakage due to inadequate hangers. Pictures should be matted or framed, but it can be very simple. Framing will not be judged except as to its appropriateness on type of picture.
6. No glass will be allowed in frames, however Plexiglas or shrink-wrap are acceptable.
7. Exhibits in this division must have been created in one of the visual arts project areas during the current 4-H year.
