### NATURAL COLORED SPINNING WOOL—SECTION 3

1. This show is for high quality fleeces intended for hand spinning use.
2. Fleeces must be shown in current year and represent twelve months growth or less. Yearling fleeces will be allowed 16 months growth.
3. Definition of color: "White is white, black is black, and everything else is colored".
4. Fleeces must be skirted and should be very clean.
5. Fleeces will be shown loosely tied in clear plastic bags.
6. Fleeces may either be from a ram or a ewe.

## DEPT. FLO—FLORICULTURE

Persons with disabilities and wishing special consideration may enter classes at the fair. The letter "T" should be added behind the class number on the entry form.

- ENTRY TAGS MUST BE SECURELY ATTACHED TO EACH EXHIBIT BY THE EXHIBITOR BEFORE EXHIBITS ARE ENTERED. USE STRING ONLY TO ATTACH TAGS TO BOTTLES JARS AND VASES. RUBBER BANDS NOT ALLOWED.

1. All flowers exhibited must have been grown in Wyoming by the exhibitor. Only one flower/plant may be entered in each class. The superintendents in charge of this department shall have the right to remove, at any time, from display, exhibits or parts of exhibits that have become unsightly. However, exhibitors are welcome, and encouraged, to replace any wilted or damaged flowers after the first day. These changes will aid in keeping the entire floriculture department more attractive for the entire duration. Flowers should be well preserved in transit. For longer lasting display, flowers should be cut early in the morning, or after sundown the previous day, with the longest stems possible, including the foliage. Place in cool area, in tepid water, for a minimum of 4 hours (preferably overnight), to completely harden. A sharp knife is best for cutting, making a diagonal cut on the stem (to allow as many plant cells as possible to be exposed) thus permitting the flowers to absorb a great deal of water.
2. Exhibitors must furnish containers in proportion to size of bloom. Containers are to be clear glass or plastic bottles and jars, or clear glass or plastic inexpensive vases (free of labels), (No artificial material of any kind is allowed including plastic, styrofoam, artificial flowers, or foliage). ENTRIES MUST BE THE SOLE CREATION OF THE EXHIBITOR. After flowers are conditioned, only 1" of water should be in the container and no foliage should be in water.
3. Artistic Arrangements - Only fresh or dried, dyed or treated natural plant material may be used in artistic arrangements. No artificial material will be allowed within arrangements. Foliage, accessories, and bases may be used
