Youth may show 3 animals in each class.

POULTRY ARRIVAL:

Cages will be assigned prior to arrival based on check-in calls. Both 4-H and FFA need to call in or email their final poultry classes before August 6th. Please call the extension office for check-in call in procedures. Any poultry not checked in during the scheduled times will not be exhibited. Exhibitors can do cage and carry if they choose. If they choose cage and carry, they need to bring their own cages for day of show. No more than 3 entries per class will be allowed.

Check-in will be Monday, August 8th from 1-5 PM only. All birds must pass the health inspection before entering the poultry barn. Cage and carry birds will be inspected the morning of the show. Dr. Emerich may ask for permission to take a mouth swab from random birds to test for Avian Influenza.

Check out will be August 13th after 3 PM or you must obtain an early release form from the Fair Board office.

Poultry Rules

1. All birds must pass the vet check before they are put into show cages.
2. Animals unable to move normally, have bare backs, or appear unthrifty will not be allowed at the fair. The fair veterinarian has final say if an animal will be allowed on fair grounds.
3. Birds should be in adult plumage and/or at least 4 months old.
4. Market pen birds must be between 50 and 90 days of age.
5. Cage and Carry may be used for poultry unable to stay at the fair. Exhibitors must provide their own cage to show in. Birds in cage and carry must be in place prior to 8 am on show day and removed from the fair before 8 pm on show day. Cage and carry birds must pass a health inspection by either a show supervisor or a fair veterinarian.
6. Only three entries per class will be allowed.

7. All poultry must be called in to the Superintendent prior to bringing them to the Fair.
8. All poultry except market animals must be part of the regular project prior to June 1.
9. No poultry will be on the grounds that are not entered in a class.
10. Any birds placed in cages not assigned will not be judged.
11. Poultry will be taken care of by the exhibitor. Parents will be able to help only with initial set up and removal. Feed and water must be available at all times. Animals not taken care of in an appropriate manner will be excused from the grounds and all prize money will be forfeited.
12. Birds maybe entered in only one class, not including showmanship.
13. A trio should consist of one male and two females of approximately the same age.
14. All birds must be able to be handled by the judge. Birds not able to be handled will be disqualified.

212 MEAT PRODUCTION PEN - Trio

Trio Suitable for meat, any breed or cross. Birds must be hatched after January 1 of the current year. This is not the market pen for sale. This is the pen that will produce the best market pen.

Three pullets or hens, must be in lay. Any breed or cross.

DAIRY GOATS

DEPT. CON – SECT 17

Showmanship will not be combined but held separately prior to the judging of the individual dairy classes.

1. Only does will be shown in the dairy classes. No bucks will be on the grounds.
2. Animals must be owned by the 4-H or FFA member by June 1 of the current year.
3. No horned animals allowed on the grounds.
4. Tattoos and proof of ownership will be checked upon arrival by the Superintendent.
5. All exhibitors in dairy classes must show in white.
6. Dairy classes will be judged according to the American Dairy Goat Association rules and regulations. Goats registered as Purebred or American or unregistered Native on Appearance, will be shown in their respective breed class. All other dairy animals show in the Recorded Grade Class.
7. All goats will be bedded. Straw is allowed.
8. Non-Dairy will be judged and shown according to breed standards.
9. Please have all animals fed, watered and tended to before 9:30 a.m. each day and before leaving each evening. Any goats not receiving proper care will not be judged, will not receive premiums, and will be sent home.
10. SHOWMANSHIP: The beginning showmanship class is for the junior 4-H person who has never shown a goat before. No trophy will be awarded for this class; ribbons only. The top individual in the beginning class has the option to enter the junior showmanship contest to compete for the opportunity to represent Laramie County at the State Fair.
11. Dairy Herd – Entry to consist of 4 dairy animals owned by one exhibitor. Senior does only.
